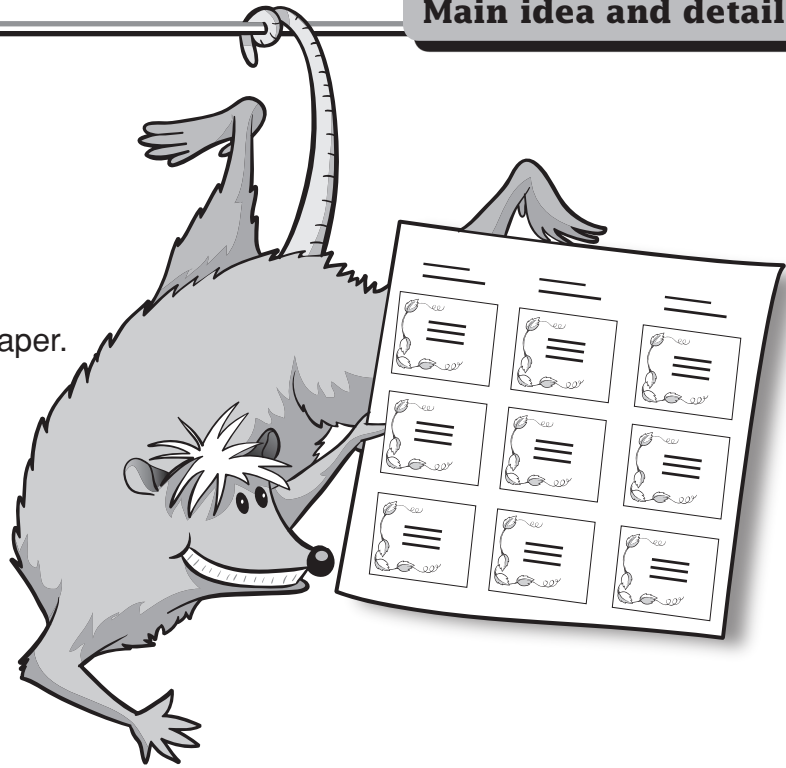











# Sorting It Out

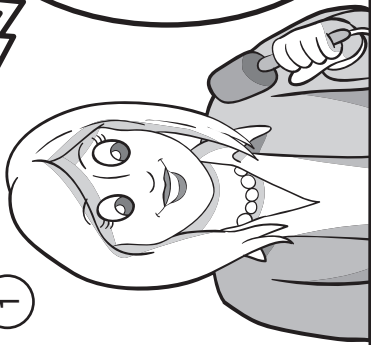
