

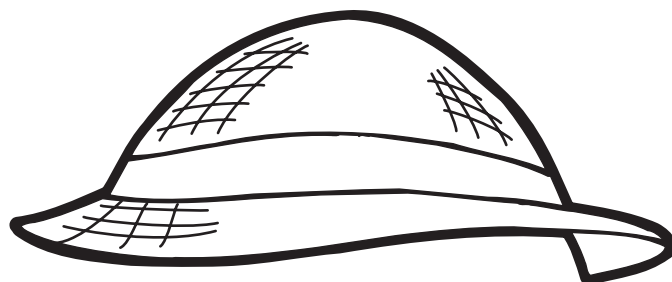
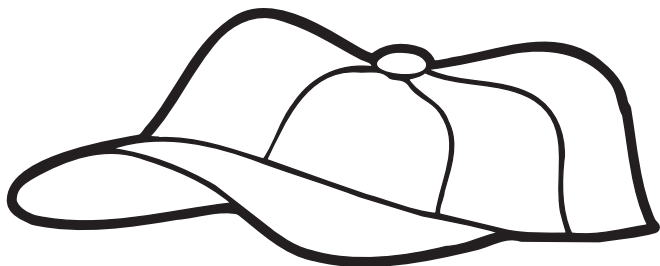

- crayons
- scissors

Note To The Teacher

This booklet is designed to allow your students to complete it with personal gains made during the school year. Some students will draw to complete each page, and some will write words or sentences and draw to complete each page.

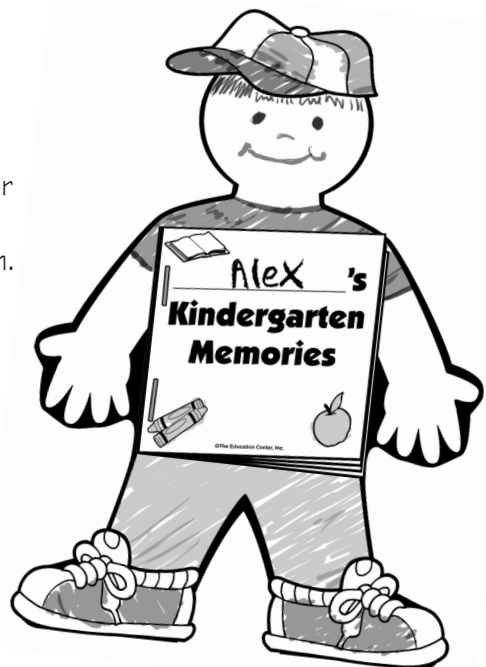


How To Use Pages 41, 43, And 45

Before making this booklet with your youngsters, you may want to discuss some of the things they have learned in kindergarten. If desired, write student responses on a chart to refer to as each page is completed. Then read the text to your students and ask them to follow the directions below to create a “Kindergarten Memories” booklet.

1. Write your name on the booklet cover and color it as desired.
2. Draw and color or write to complete each page.
3. Color the person pattern to resemble yourself and cut it out.
4. Color and cut out the shoe patterns and one hat pattern; glue them in place.
5. Cut out all of the booklet pages; stack them in order behind the cover. Place the stack on top of the person pattern and staple along the left side as shown.
6. Read your booklet to a friend.

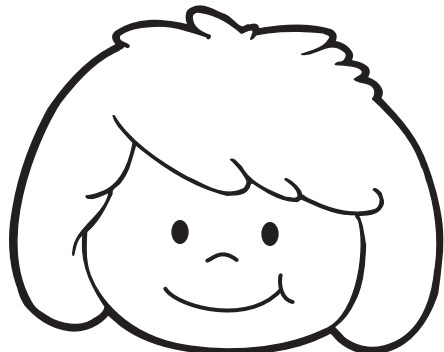
Nametags



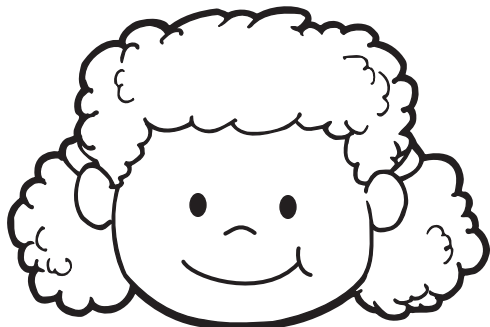
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Note to the teacher: Duplicate and cut apart to make a class supply of tags. Have each child write her name on a tag and color it. Tape these tags on desks or cubbies.
